#### **APPLICATION REPORT**

#### 1. Background:

An application for a provisional premises licence for a restaurant and bar with off sale facility on the ground floor.

The hours of operation requested are on sales 10:00 to 00:30 every day and off sale 10:00 to 22:00 every day. The applicant also requests an additional hour to on sales during the period 1st December to 2nd January.

The applicant intends to provide conference and restaurant facilities, bar meals, receptions, club meetings, recorded music and live performances.

Children and Young People will be permitted on the premises until the end of Core Hours for the purpose of having a meal, attending a function or for work purposes.

The premises were previously licensed for on sales with that licence being surrendered on 18<sup>th</sup> July 2014.

The application requests a capacity of 50 persons.

#### 2. Reports

There have been no objections or representations from the public.

Police Scotland have submitted a representation – Appendix 3

A Section 50 certificate from Planning has been lodged along with the application and further section 50 certificates will be required from Building Standards and Environmental Health before any licence can be confirmed.

The applicant has provided a disabled access and facilities statement -Appendix 1.

The applicant has provided details of how they will meet the licensing objectives – Appendix 2.

## 3. Board Options

The Board must, in considering and determining the application consider whether any of the grounds for refusal applies and-

- (A) if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application, or
- (B) if any of them applies, the Board must refuse the application.

The grounds for refusal are—

- (a) that the subject premises are excluded premises. Excluded premises are defined as premises used as a garage or which form part of premises which are so used. Premises are used as a garage if they are used for one or more of the following-
- (b) the sale by retail of petrol or derv
- (c) the sale of motor vehicles. or
- (d) the maintenance of motor vehicles

However, premises used for the sale by retail of petrol or derv, or which form part of premises so used, are not excluded premises if persons resident in the locality in which the premises are situated are, or are likely to become , reliant to a significant extent on the premises as the principal source of -

(i)petrol or derv, or

- (ii)groceries (where the premises are, or are to be, used also for the sale by retail of groceries).
- (C) that the application must be refused under section 25(2), 64(2) or 65(3),
- (D) that the Licensing Board considers that the granting of the application would be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives,
- (E) that, having regard to-
- (i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises,
- (ii) the location, character and condition of the premises, and
- (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises,
- the Board considers that the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol,
- (e) that, having regard to the number and capacity of-
- (i) licensed premises, or
- (ii) licensed premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises,
- in the locality in which the subject premises are situated, the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed premises of that description, in the locality.

- 3. A licensed taxi service can be contacted in the event customers require onward transportation
- 4. No bottles or rubbish to be put in outside bins after 22.00 hours
- 5. Regular inspection and cleaning of outside area.

#### Securing Public Safety


- 1. The premises has in place procedures for :
  - entry and exit control
  - · evacuation procedures
  - · accident / incident reporting and recording
- 2. Daily inspections are undertaken and recorded to check
  - · all exit routes and signage
- 3. There are appropriate fire extinguishers in the premises
- 4. All members of staff are provided with appropriate training and supervision to assist in securing customers safety.

#### **Protecting and Improving Public Health**

- 1. Posters will be displayed containing sensible drinking messages
- 2. All members of staff are trained to be aware of the risks of excessive consumption of alcohol and when to refuse service.
- 3. A wide selection of non-alcoholic drinks are available
- 4. Our menu will include healthier options to allow customers to make informed choices about their food.

#### Protection of Children from Harm
