What is the process for tender for Food and Bars and will South Ayrshire businesses be involved?	This year we are facilitating a local traders' village, which is open to applications from South Ayrshire based businesses only. It will be free of charge to trade in the village and all of the necessary event infrastructure will be provided, such as hand washing facilities, fridges, tables and chairs, power, wi-fi etc. The village is open to traders from all trading sectors such as food, drink and retail. The Council will manage the village directly and the closing date for applications is 14 June 2024
		We will also have a commercial route where food vans and trucks and ice cream vans can pay a fee to trade at the event. This will be managed by an appointed Local Food Village Manager. We published a Prior Information Notice on Public Contracts Scotland which meant anyone could note an interest in the Quick Quote. We received notes of interest from a range of businesses throughout Scotland. As there was enough local interest, we plan to only invite South Ayrshire businesses to the Quick Quote
		The bar provider was appointed through the Public Contracts Scotland Quick Quote process. South Ayrshire based businesses were invited to the Quick Quote, however the successful applicant is based out with South Ayrshire. They were appointed based on quality and income for the Council

Outdoor play area "shovel ready" project list Could I please have an update on the action to develop "an ongoing priority list of 'shovel-ready' improvements that could be implemented in each ward as and when funding becomes available", as agreed as part of my motion to Council in June 2023?	The projects identified for the Troon Area as part of the Ward funding have been developed and are going through the tender process. The Grounds service have also applied for and been successful in gaining external funding to provide some more inclusive play equipment which will be included in some future projects. Unfortunately, the post that is dedicated to the design, maintenance, inspection and implementation of new play area/equipment has not been filled since a retiral in June 2023 due to budget constraints. This has meant there has been no further progress with regards to shovel ready projects across South Ayrshire. The Service Lead Neighbourhood Services is currently assessing roles within the service and intending to fill this post in the near future which will alleviate some of the pressure on the service and enable the project work to be undertaken
2.	Troon Library  Could I please request an assurance that the ramp access to the entrance of the relocated Troon Library will comply with current Building Standards in their entirety, including gradient, width, length of flights, dimensions of landings, visibility, handrails and surface material – in line with the condition approved by Council in October 2023, and not be reliant on relaxations of the Building Standards?	Th existing entrance ramp at Troon Municipal Building will be widened and regraded as part of the library relocation works  The gradients are constrained by site conditions but are a significant improvement on the current ramp. All other items will meet current standards

3.	Flooding  Further to my unanswered enquiries of 24th January, 13th February, 16th April and 10th May, could I please have a comment on the condition of the field west of Struthers Primary School where the flooding over the last two winters has been significantly worse than that experienced in the past. The level of flooding would seem to exceed the expectations in the flood risk assessment carried out before the new EYC building was approved and it may be there's a partial blockage in the culvert the Struthers Burn runs into at the corner of the field; my January request that this be inspected seemed a reasonable starting point.	The land to the west of Struthers PS has been prone to flooding for a number of years and pre-dates the new early years centre constructed to the east of the school  Ayrshire Roads Alliance to check that the culvert on the Struthers Burn is clear
4.	Enquiry response times  At March Council I asked a supplementary question requesting if an agreed timescale can be put in place for responding to member enquiries, accepting more complex enquiries will take longer to respond to than routine ones. The Chief Executive advised he would discuss this with officers and reply direct. Having not yet received a reply can I please have an update on this?	Response times for Members' enquiries are being reviewed as part of trialling of the caseload management system by Members Support and ICT. Pending conclusion of that trial, a reminder will be issued to officers that responses should ideally be provided within 48 hours and, where they are unable to respond within that timescale, a reason and estimated respond time is provided
5.	Open lessons  Having twice asked for a copy of feedback notes from the 2016 golf Open in Troon, it seems that no such records were retained by SAC meaning that a number of issues which have arisen in recent months may have been avoidable.
