Welcome to our guide to the UK Parliamentary General Election count on Thursday 4 July 2024, which will get underway as soon as possible after polls close at 10:00pm.

I am Returning Officer for the Ayr, Carrick and

Cumnock, and Central Ayrshire constituencies and the count for these areas will take place at the Citadel Leisure Centre in Ayr.

This guide sets out all you need to know about the election and the count – who is standing for election, where the polling stations are, where the count's happening, when it's happening, how the count centre will be set up, and how the votes will be counted and the results declared

My main aim is to deliver an efficient, secure and accurate count, so I won't speculate about timings for the declarations; however, I do expect this to be well into the early hours of the morning of Friday 5 July 2024.

Postal vote opening and checking

The opening and checking of postal votes will initially take place in County Hall, County Buildings, Wellington Square, Ayr KA7 1DR and can be observed by those with the appropriate accreditation only.

Postal vote opening involves opening the returned postal ballot packs and checking the Postal Vote Statement only to ensure the

authenticity of the voter and ballot. This is done by comparing the signature and date of birth against the details held on file from the original postal vote application.

The opening of postal votes and the checking of postal vote statements will get underway on Tuesday 25 June 2024, and the timetable is provided below:

First stage and Returning Officer adjudication, regarding the acceptance of postal vote statements, will take place during opening.

As the timetable indicates, the postal vote opening will relocate to the Conference Room at the Citadel Leisure Centre on Thursday 4

July 2024, with sessions from 7pm onwards for both constituencies.

This will allow all valid postal votes to be included in the count as quickly as possible.


Count venue

The election count will take place in the main hall of the Citadel Leisure Centre, South Harbour Street, Ayr KA7 1JB from 10pm on Thursday 4 July 2024.

Parking in the Citadel Leisure Centre car park will be strictly limited and will only be available to those who have been allocated a parking space by the Returning Officer.

The count centre will open for candidates and agents from 9:30pm.

Alternative free car parking for those attending the count is available at the nearby Cromwell Road car park, which is shown on the map.

Count access and accreditation

Access to the count centre - for those with the appropriate accreditation - will be available from 9:30pm on Thursday 4 July 2024.

All visitors must enter the Citadel via the main entrance and report to the security desk at the entrance to the main hall.

Only those with valid accreditation will be allowed access. If you are collecting your passes at the Citadel, you will also need to

have a suitable form of photographic ID, such as driving licence, passport, or press card. Accreditation passes can only be used by the named holder and must be worn at all times. Our accreditation passes are colour-coded, so we can see who is who and ensure that people have access to the relevant permitted areas.

Count centre

The count centre is expected to be set up as shown overleaf in our layout plan, although this is subject to change based on operational demands on equipment and resources.

The count centre will have two identical count areas – one for each constituency. Each constituency will be overseen by Depute Returning Officers:

- Ayr, Carrick and Cumnock: Lyndsay McRoberts and Wynne Carlaw
- Central Ayrshire: Catriona Caves and Christine McMenamin

Some tables and chairs will be provided in the main hall, as well as access to power points and wifi – this is primarily for election candidates and agents.


The main guest area will be within the Ark, which is located directly off the main hall where the count is taking place.

The Ark includes ample seating and largescreen TVs where you can keep up with election news and developments during the count.

There is a separate secure wifi connection within the Ark - the password for access will be available to those in attendance.

There will also be a speaker feed into the Ark, so any announcements from the main count centre can be picked up.





Count process

The counting of votes for the UK Parliamentary General Election will get underway from 10pm on Thursday 4 July 2024.

This will include postal votes that have been opened and processed in advance of polling day. Postal votes opened and checked on polling day will be added in as soon as they have been processed.

The count will be conducted using a 'mini count' model – this breaks down the count for each constituency into sections, with each section working to an identical detailed procedure.

There will be five sections in operation for each constituency: A-E for Ayr, Carrick and Cumnock and F-J for Central Ayrshire. Each section will have 12 count assistants and a section supervisor, who will be responsible for overseeing the section allocated to them.

Ballot box arrival

Postal votes and ballot boxes from each polling station will be brought to the Citadel and checked in on arrival.

Ballot boxes will be allocated to each of the sections (with allocations based on expected time of ballot box arrival and maximum number of ballot papers). Details of the ballot box allocations will available at the count.

Ballot boxes are opened and emptied on to tables, with ballot papers handled face up at all times.

There are two stages to the election count – counting the number of ballot papers (known

as verification) and counting the votes on the ballot papers (the actual count).

Verification: counting the number of ballot papers

Verification involves the staff counting the number of papers within each ballot box and checking this against the number of ballot papers issued, taking account of both the unused and any spoilt ballot papers.

This ensures that all ballot papers issued at the polling stations and all postal votes received are included in the count.

If the number of ballot papers does not match the number of ballot papers expected from that ballot box, the papers will be recounted until the numbers match or until the same number of ballot papers is arrived at twice in a row.

Any discrepancies between the numbers on the ballot paper account – the form completed by the Presiding Officer at the polling station to account for how many ballot papers have been issued – and the number of ballot papers are recorded

The Returning Officer will prepare a statement showing how many ballot papers were received in each ballot box against how many ballot papers were expected. A copy of this statement will be given to candidates and agents.

Once the verification process is complete for a constituency, the Returning Officer will be able to confirm turnout – the percentage poll – for that constituency.

The counting of the votes

Once verification is complete for a constituency, the actual count will then get underway.

Ballot papers will remain within the sections they were allocated to, so will be counted where they were verified.

The enumerators will sort the ballot papers by candidate – any doubtful ballot papers (where the ballot paper doesn't have one 'X' only next to a candidate's name) will be passed to the Depute Returning Officer for adjudication. Please note, a 'tick' ($\sqrt{}$) will be accepted in place of the 'X'.

As long as the voter's intention is clear from the ballot paper, the Depute Returning Officer will accept the ballot paper as a valid vote and it will be included in the count.

If the intention is not clear, the vote is rejected and not included in the count. Adjudication determinations will be based on the official 'placemat' and any supporting guidance provided by the Electoral Commission. Copies of these will be available at the count.

Candidates and agents will be invited to the adjudication table for their constituency to view the adjudication process.

The sections will then count the number of votes cast for each candidate, with a central team calculating the totals for the constituency.

Once all the valid votes and any rejected votes have been added together and checked against the total number of ballot papers from verification, the Returning Officer will share the provisional result with candidates and their agents.

Candidates and agents can ask for a recount of votes; however, the Returning Officer can refuse the request if they think it is unreasonable.

Declaration

Results for the Ayr, Carrick and Cumnock and Central Ayrshire constituencies will be declared as soon the results are confirmed - this means we could have a result for one constituency while the other is still being counted.

After consulting the candidates and agents, the Returning Officer will announce the votes cast for all candidates and declare the candidate with the most votes as the candidate elected to be the MP for the constituency.

The candidate elected will have a brief opportunity to speak, followed by the other candidates in alphabetical order (the same order as the ballot paper).

If two or more candidates have the same number of votes, and a further vote would see one of those candidates elected, the Returning Officer must decide between them by drawing lots.


