AT EDINBURGH the eighth day of December in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty between the hours of twelve and one afternoon the Extract Decree underwritten with Warrant of Registration thereon was presented by G. Quade, Writer, Edinburgh, and is with said Warrant of Registra-

tion recorded as follows vizt. :-

AT EDINBURGH the fifth day of November in the year Nineteen hundred and twenty: In the proceedings instituted before the Lords of Council and Session by Petition presented to the said Lords for Gilbert Kennedy, Farmer, Delamford, Dailly; George Adam, Teacher, sometime Barr, now at Jackson Schoolhouse, East Kilbride; John Lammie, Barr; George Bruce Faulds, Teacher, Helensburgh; Reverend Edward Brown, Annbank, Ayrshire, the Trustees nominated and appointed by and acting under the Trust Disposition and Settlement executed by the Reverend John Angus, Minister of the United Free Church of Scotland Congregation, Barr, Ayrshire, dated second September Nineteen hundred and eighteen, Petitioners; which Petition sets forth inter alia that the said John Angus died on ninth September Nineteen hundred and eighteen leaving the said Trust Disposition and Settlement by which he appointed the Petitioners to be his Trustees. The Petitioners all accepted office: That at the date of his death the said John Angus was infeft in All and Whole the subjects in the village and parish of Barr hereinafter described. He was so infeft conform to Disposition granted by Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame, Esquire of Dimmurchie, in the County of Ayr, and residing at Fairlie House, near Kilmarnock, in his favour, dated twenty fourth May and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines applicable to the County of

Ayr tenth June both in the year Nineteen hundred and eleven: And that upon the subjects thereby disposed there had since the date of said Disposition, been erected an Institute in which there is inter alia a library. That although the said Disposition is in favour of Mr Angus as an individual, and although it bears that it was granted in consideration of a payment of One hundred pounds made by Mr Angus it is the case that Mr Angus held the said subjects and the buildings thereon as Trustee for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Barr: The said Institute was erected with money collected by Mr Angus with the intention, avowed by him, of erecting and maintaining a Library for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Barr: That Mr Angus died without having assumed any other person to act as Trustees and on his death the Trust accordingly lapsed: It was necessary that a new Trustee should be appointed, and accordingly application was made under and in virtue of the Trusts (Scotland) Act Eighteen hundred and sixty seven, and particularly sections twelve and thirteen thereof: SITTING IN JUDGMENT the said Lords having considered the Petition and proceedings, and heard Counsel for the Petitioners, Nominated and Appointed and hereby Nominate and Appoint George Bruce Faulds, Teacher, Helensburgh to be Trustee to act in the said Trust mentioned in the Petition in room and place of the said

deceased Reverend John Angus, with power to the said George Bruce Faulds to carry out the purposes of the said Trust: Further Granted Warrant to and Authorised and hereby Grant Warrant to and Authorise the said George Bruce Faulds to complete a title in his own name as Trustee foresaid to the following property which the said Reverend John Angus held for the benefit of the said Trust, namely :- In the first place All and Whole that piece of ground of a triangular shape lying in the village and Parish of Barr and County of Ayr extending to three roods and twenty three poles imperial measure or thereby, and bounded as follows, namely, on the north or north east by the road separating the said piece of ground from the churchyard and feus of part of the Barr lands; on the west by the road separating it from the Parish church and glebe; and on the south east by vacant ground lying between it and the road leading from Penkill to Barr, all as delineated and coloured pink on the plan or sketch annexed and subscribed as relative to a Disposition granted by Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame, Esquire of Dimmurchie, in the County of Ayr, and residing at Fairlie House, near Kilmarnock, in favour of the Reverend John Angus, Minister of the United Free Church of Scotland congregation, Barr, dated twenty fourth May and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines applicable to the County of Ayr tenth June, both in the year Nineteen hundred and

eleven, which piece of ground is part and portion of All and Whole the said Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame's lands and estate of Dimmurchie, lying within the Parish of Barr, late Bailiary of Carrick and Sherifffdom of Ayr being the subjects described in the Disposition by William Cathcart Smith Cuninghame, Esquire of Caprington, in the County of Ayr, in favour of the said Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame, dated twenty second, and recorded in the said Division of the General Register of Sasines on twenty third January Eighteen hundred and eighty nine; with the teinds, parsonage and vicarage of the ground disposed by the said Disposition in favour of the said John Angus, in so far as the said Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame had right thereto: and in the second place all the right title and interest which the said Douglas Alexander Smith Cuninghame had in and to the piece of ground lying between the piece of ground disposed by the said Disposition in favour of the said John Angus and the said road from Penkill to Barr, and in and to the piece of ground between said road st ~~the~~ and the water of Gregg, all as shown within the lines coloured mauve on the said plan or sketch: and Decerned and hereby Decern: Found and hereby Find the Petitioners entitled to payment out of the said Trust estate of the expenses of and incident to the application: EXTRACTED upon five pages by me Assistant Extractor in the Court of Session
