6	<p>Treasurer’s Report Defibrillator Fund - £1687.28. Admin Fund - £50.37. Pads will need to be purchased from the Defibrillator Fund in June when they expire. Noticeboards were ordered by Ian Douglas, our Treasurer, and were delivered to his house. Unfortunately, the boards only had one “leg” to hold up the front “window” and are being replaced. 7	<p>Planning and Licensing Nothing to report from our area.</p>	
8	<p>Secretary Correspondence. BKCC are very pleased that we have a new member who joins us on April 1, 2025 – Dianne Markham. This will mean that our membership remains at a good level of 10 out of a possible 13.</p> <p>New Pharmacy Application – none of the four CCs within the catchment area of the proposed pharmacy chose to attend the formal Hearing.</p> <p>There was a long and comprehensive discussion with Brian McGinley about precisely what capital projects we wish to spend part of the £1m Ayr East Ward funding on in Belmont/Kincaidston.</p>	Secretary to put notice up in noticeboards of the appointment of Dianne Markham from Belmont to the BKCC.

	<p>Woodpark play area landscaping/trees/extra hard surface area for outdoor events/new paths/new equipment</p> <p>The Mount grass area behind the bus stop – improvements to the hard surface at the bus stop to make it larger and able to accommodate the bin, improvement to the pavement and kerb at the edge of the grass area where pedestrians walk through mud to get to the bus stop. Pavement to be installed all the way around the grass area instead of stopping at the entrance to the cul-de-sac. Further enhancements could be made to this area such as an electricity supply behind the bus stop so that a Christmas tree could be displayed in December.</p> <p>Foot of Burnbank Road and Railway Tunnel plus entrance to path to Kincaidston – improvements could be made to the poor road surface on Burbank Road just in front of the railway tunnel and the entrance to path.</p> <p>Railway Tunnel - Railways Authority to make sure that brambles do not continue to grow down from the embankment getting in the way of pedestrians. Embankment area is very messy and collects litter. Can improvements be made to the narrow pavement for pedestrians going through the tunnel. Railway tunnel arch should be painted in reflective paint to make the archway more visible to traffic on both sides.</p> <p>Wooded area high up from Andersen Crescent – this area is littered with heavy items and needs a clear up. Biodiversity initiatives could take place in this natural space.</p> <p>Kincaidston lighting to be reviewed at night.</p> <p>A new freestanding noticeboard at Kincaidston shops.</p> <p>Request was made for councillors to ask for reopening of the second exit from Kincaidston which goes under the railway line onto Maybole Road.</p>	<p>Secretary to send photos and a list of project ideas to Brian McGinley so that he can put these up for discussion with SAC.</p>
	<p>AOCB</p> <p>CC agreed to ask UnderSky to organise a fun-day event for children in Belmont and Kincaidston sometime during the summer holidays which we will submit a funding application for.</p>	<p>Secretary to fill out application form for funding from the Ayr South Health and Social Care Partnership for the Fun-Day Event.</p>
