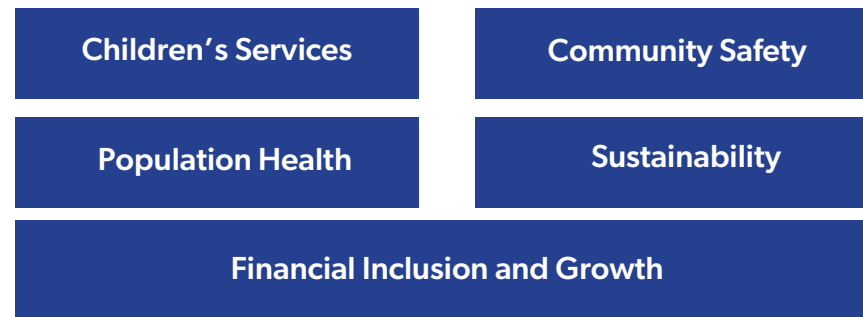
## Who we are

The South Ayrshire Community Planning Board (CPP Board or simply the Board) is the executive and decision-making body of South Ayrshire Community Planning Partnership (CPP). It makes decisions on the priorities, strategic outcomes, and objectives for the CPP.

## Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015

The Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015, states that community planning is about how public bodies work together, and with the local community, to plan for, resource and provide or secure the provision of services which improve local outcomes in a local authority area, with a view to reducing inequalities.

Under part 2 of the Act, the Community Planning Partnership must prepare a Local Outcome Improvement Plan which sets out the priorities of the CPP and Locality Plans for areas of socioeconomic disadvantage.

## Child Poverty Strategy

Our strategic approach to our Child Poverty is underpinned by our shared commitment across all community planning partners to work in collaboration to reduce inequalities and improve outcomes for everyone in South Ayrshire supporting our vision of 'growing, caring and living a better life'. The strategy is supported by an action plan.

## Locality Planning Partnership

A Locality Planning Partnership (LPP) is an opportunity for our communities in South Ayrshire to have influence and make a difference to people's health and wellbeing. Each LPP set their own priorities based on the needs of the local community. In South Ayrshire Locality Planning fulfils both Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 and part 2 of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015.

- Troon and Villages LPP

- Maybole and North Carrick LPP
