

We need access to keep your home safe!

The Council, as a landlord, has a legal requirement to ensure that all gas appliances and flues in your home are checked and certified as being "safe" every year.

To meet this legal requirement the Council must access all houses with gas appliances to carry out a service and safety check every year. At the same time the Engineer also checks that your smoke detectors are working. We need your help to keep your home safe!

When the annual gas safety check in your property is due, our contractor, PH Jones, will write to you to offer an appointment for the work to be carried out. If the date or time does not suit. then please call the number on the letter to arrange a convenient date and time that does.

Most tenants provide access to the contractor so that they can carry out the annual safety check within the required time.

However, a small number of people do not arrange or agree entry to the property with the Contractor.

In line with legislation, the Council is entitled to force entry in such circumstances and this is also a provision of the Council's tenancy agreement.

The safety check must be carried out within 365 days of the previous service date.

The Council will have no choice but to force entru and change the locks to the properties of tenants who have refused to allow entry. If the Council are required to force entry to your home, you will be charged for the costs of this action and also renewing the locks, this will be a minimum of £61.97.

Please avoid this expense by allowing entry to the gas engineer. It is easy and can be arranged at a time that suits you.

Winter Safety IN AND AROUND YOUR HOME

During the winter months, we all try to keep ourselves warm at home. However, it is essential that we make sure our homes are healthy, safe and protected. Follow our top tips to ensure you remember this winter for all the right reasons.

PREVENTING BURST PIPES

Burst pipes can cause significant and costly damage to your home and possessions. To avoid this:

- Make sure you know where your Stopcock and Sure Stop are.
- Check your water Stopcock and Sure Stop are working properly.
- Keep your home warm whenever possible, even when it is unoccupied.
- Make sure there are no draughts from outside, especially near water pipes.
- Keep windows closed in unheated parts of your home.
- Ensure you know where and how to switch off your electricity and heating safely.

HEAT YOUR HOME SAFELY

We check the safety of your gas appliances every year, but if you smell gas, think you have a gas leak, or are worried that fumes containing carbon monoxide are escaping from a gas appliance, call the free National Gas emergency line immediately on 0800 111 999.

If you have a solid fuel heating system (wood, coal etc):

- Have your chimney swept twice a year to reduce the risk of a chimney fire.
- Do not sit too close to fires or heaters your clothing or furniture could catch fire.
- Always use a fireguard with open fires, especially if you have young children, elderly or disabled people in the property. The fireguard should preferably be in a fixed position.

If you use a portable heater to boost the heat in your home, make sure you keep it clean and well maintained. If you have stored the heater away over the spring and summer months, make sure you thoroughly clean off any dust before use.

To keep yourself and your family safe, we also recommend you have a carbon monoxide detector in your home, speak to your Housing Officer for more information on 0300 900 123.

If you are over 60, disabled or on a low income, you may be able to get financial help with heating your home. Contact the Energy Agency on 01292 521896 for further information.

BE PREPARED FOR SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

During winter, we can experience severe disruption to our daily routine. Here are some tips to help you prepare for severe weather conditions:

- Check the batteries in your torch are working and have some emergency lighting handy in preparation for a power cut.
- Report any lighting faults immediately.
- Be sure you have some warm shoes or boots with non-slip soles.
- Keep a mixture of salt and sand handy to put on steps or paths in icy weather.
- Keep simple cold, flu and sore throat remedies in the house.
 (Your pharmacist can make suggestions and can advise on how to manage minor illnesses)
- If you are invited to have a flu jab, be sure to follow this up.
- Order repeat prescriptions in plenty of time, particularly if bad weather is forecast.
- Keep basic food items in the cupboard or freezer in case it is too cold to go shopping.
- Unless you must go out in severe weather, stay at home.





The Tenant Hardship Grant by the Scottish Government

The Scottish Government has set up a Tenant Covid Hardship Grant Fund to provide financial help to tenants in social housing and in the private sector who are at risk of becoming homeless due to falling behind with rent payments related to the impact of the Covid pandemic.

The grants will help tenants who have struggled financially as a direct result allowing them to reduce or pay-off any rent arrears they have built up subject to an agreement between the tenant and their respective landlord. The grants are available to tenants in Council, housing association or privately rented accommodation and if awarded, do not have to be paid back.

South Ayrshire Council along with all other Local Authorities have been awarded an allocation of funding which at this point is available to use until 31st March 2022.

The scheme is designed to be flexible but there is an eligibility criteria set by the Scottish Government:

- The grants are limited to helping with rent arrears that built-up between 23 March 2020 and 9 August 2021 along with any exceptional circumstances beyond this date.
- Grants can be used to make a full or partial payment of arrears depending on individual circumstances
- Grants will be targeted towards current tenants who are at risk of becoming homeless and do not have any other way of clearing the arrears
- Private sector landlords should be registered on the <u>Scottish</u> <u>Landlord Register</u>
- Landlords should have carried out steps to resolve the issue before making an application in line with pre-action requirements
- Payments will be made to landlords rather than tenants on the strict condition that the payment will be used to credit the tenant's rent account, and that any ongoing proceedings to end the tenancy will be ceased with prior agreement of this confirmed and acknowledged.

Our aim is to ensure funding is targeted towards supporting households who are at the greatest risk of losing their home and preventing homelessness.

HOW TO APPLY

ARE YOU INSURED? Peace Of Mind This Winter

It's the time of year, when everyone seems busy, rushing around. But is it time to consider, if an accident were to happen in your home, would your home contents and personal belongings be protected?

We all see what devastating effects the weather can have, from gale force winds, rainwater flooding and frost bursting pipes. The Council's pay-as-you-go home contents insurance scheme, offers cover for damage to your contents caused by storms or floods, falling trees and branches, as well as fire, theft and much more.

Here's some tips to keep your home safe this winter:

- If you are away from your home, close and lock all doors and windows, ask a neighbour to keep an eye out.
- Don't leave candles or flames unattended.
- Regularly clear debris from drains and ditches.
- Insulate pipes and water tanks. Wrap pipes in cold areas with pipe sponge covers.
- Consider home contents insurance.

We hope that you will never suffer a flood or water damage, but these things do happen and that is why we suggest all tenants take out home contents, either through this special scheme or by making your own arrangements. Please remember you are responsible for replacing your home contents and belongings.

Contents insurance is designed to help protect your possessions and personal belongings It's a good idea to consider what a home contents insurance policy would cover you for in order to help you make an informed decision on whether you need one.

Rent Non - Charging Fortnight 2021

Remember there is a non-charging rental fortnight from Thursday 16th
December 2021 - Wednesday
29th December 2021. This means that as long as you are up to date with your rent, you don't need to make a payment for this period.

If you pay by Direct Debit or monthly Standing Order your payments should be made as normal as payments are calculated over the year.

If you get help towards paying your rent as part of your Universal Credit payment, this is also calculated over the year and you should continue to make your normal monthly rent payment.

If your rent is not up to date, you must continue to pay during the non-charging fortnight to help you catch up with your payments and reduce your rent arrears.

If you are struggling to pay your rent it is important that you contact us right away. Your Housing Officer can offer advice and information to help you manage your rent payments.

Home Energy Grants

Energy prices are going up but there are lots of ways that we can help with home energy to keep you connected.

Our Home Energy Grants can help you by providing an energy voucher to top up your pre-paid meter by up to £50 dependant on who you live with. We also work with the Energy Agency to help you if you are in debt with your energy bills. Other grants may also be available.

Protecting Our Employees

We request that tenants do not smoke within their property when an employee of the Council is visiting. This includes when repairs or general maintenance is being carried out or when a contractor is carrying out work on the Council's behalf.

It is good practice not to smoke in the property for at least 30 minutes before an employee visits your property. Please help us to protect our employees from second-hand smoke. This includes vape or vaping.

Employees and contractors have the right to refuse to carry out the work within the property if the tenant refuses to stop smoking.

Joan Eardley: A Painter's Life, with **Photographs by Audrey Walker**

This year is the centenary of the birth of the renowned artist Joan Eardley, born 18th May in 1921.

Rozelle House is delighted to celebrate her life and remarkable work in an exhibition kindly loaned to us by Dumfries and Galloway Council - which includes paintings, pastels and sketches alongside photographs taken by her friend Audrey Walker.

Joan Eardley's portrayal of the streets and children of Glasgow first brought her work to public attention in the early 1950s, but it was her love for the tiny village of Catterline, and its surrounding landscape near Aberdeen, which brought her both creative frustration and artistic fulfilment.

This exhibition features a selection of Joan's works bequeathed by Lady Audrey Walker in her will in 1997, works owned by the Dumfriesshire Educational Trust, and selected loans from the Walker family, as well as two short films featuring Joan at work in her Glasgow studio and interviews with her biographer and Catterline neighbours. This exhibition has been made possible as a result of the Government Indemnity Scheme.





Block (B) within our Waggon Road development is scheduled to be completed in January, with work starting on the final Block (A).


