Subject: Integration Joint Board (IJB) Annual Performance Report 2020-21

## 1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Service and Performance Panel with a copy of the Integration Joint Board (IJB) Annual Performance Report 2020-21 for scrutiny.

#### 2. Recommendation

#### 3. Background

- 3.1 The Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 obliges all Integration Authorities to publish a Performance Report covering performance over the reporting year. Due to the Scottish Government extending the Coronavirus Scotland Act (2020) to 30 September 2021, Integration Joint Boards were advised that they can delay the release of their Annual Performance Report to November 2021.
- 3.2 The Performance Report Regulations require Partnerships to assess their performance in relation to the National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes. These outcomes are set out in the <a href="Public Bodies">Public Bodies</a> (Joint Working) (National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes) (Scotland) Regulations 2014 and provide a strategic framework for the planning and delivery of health and social care services. They focus on the experiences and quality of services for people using those services, carers and their families
- Performance must be assessed in the context of the arrangements set out in a Partnership's strategic commissioning plan and financial statement, and how the expenditure allocated in the financial statement have achieved, or contributed to achieving, the health and wellbeing outcomes. It should also cover how significant decisions made by the Partnership over the course of the reporting year have contributed to progress towards the outcomes. To support this, a set of core integration indicators have been developed. Partnerships should report against these core indicators in their Performance Reports.
- 3.4 This report follows the requirements for Annual Performance Reports set out in regulation. A summary and easy-read version of the key information contained in

the Annual Performance Report have been developed to ensure the information is as accessible as possible.

- 3.5 The report contains the most up to date indicators available albeit some of these have been delayed or obscured by the pressures of the pandemic. A brief summary of in-year progress is also included in the report, including key service highlights and examples of innovative work within the HSCP.
- 3.6 It is proposed that the Service and Performance Panel notes the performance of the Health and Social Care Partnership from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021. The Covid-19 pandemic has been prevalent through the whole reporting period and has impacted on performance and service delivery. Detail on the Partnership's performance against the core integration indicators and the National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes, for the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021, can be found in the Annual Performance Report.
