What is CLD?

Community learning & development or CLD as it's more commonly known is a field of professional practice that enables people to identify their own individual and collective goals, to engage in learning and take action to bring about change for themselves and their communities.

We use a range of formal and informal methods of learning and social development with individuals and groups in their communities.

Our programmes and activities are developed in dialogue with communities and participants, working particularly with those excluded from participation in the decisions and processes that shape their lives.

Through working in these ways, CLD extends the reach of democracy and widens its scope.

Ultimately, we empower people, individually and collectively, to make positive changes in their lives and in their communities, through learning.

CLD in practice....

CLD practice includes:

- Community Development (building the capacity of communities to meet their own needs, engaging with and influencing decision makers)
- Youth work, family learning and other early intervention work with children, young people and families
- Community-based adult learning, including adult literacies and English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)
- Learning for vulnerable and disadvantaged groups in the community, for example, people with disabilities, care leavers or offenders
- > Volunteer development.

A typical week

- Youth work activity and programmes in schools and outside of school accredited and non accredited
- ✓ Parenting and Family Learning classes / PACT programmes
- Personal development and health and wellbeing groups and programmes
- Adult Learning including; accredited courses, adult literacy and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

- ✓ Community Engagement & Community Development

Parent & Family Learning

- ✓ Literacy and Numeracy based Family Learning sessions delivered weekly such as:

Youth Work.....

- Youth Clubs Over 20 youth clubs across South Ayrshire including joint delivery with key partners e.g. Girvan Youth Trust. Close links with 3rd Sector and voluntary orgs e.g. The Ark & Room Sixty.
- Gateway Group for young adults with learning or physical disabilities
- 2 Targeted youth clubs completing accreditation including Duke of Edinburgh
- Targeted Youth Group for Care Experienced Young People
- Holiday Provision October, Summer & Easter programmes
- South Ayrshire Youth Forum
- Support to MSYPs
- Young Scot / National Entitlement Card



Youth Work in Schools....

- ▶ CLD are embedded in all Secondary Schools and most Primary Schools
- Programmes usually include some form of Accreditation Hi5 / DYA / YAA / JMA etc.
- Sessions vary depending on need of the school but can include Alcohol & Drug Awareness, Mental Health & Wellbeing, Confidence & Self-Esteem, Behaviour, Attendance etc.
- ► Team Around the School approach Ayr Academy
- ▶ Garden Groups, Bike Maintenance, Allotments
- Boys Groups / Girls Groups
- Youth Work Recovery Fund
- Personal Development Programmes and PDA Award
- ► TAYP in partnership with Community Safety
- Young Scot Cards / Support to Pupil Councils / SYP Elections



Adult Learning.....

CLD PLAN 2021 - 2024

Key messages:

- ► The CLD Plan is a partnership plan which provides the opportunity for relevant partners, including local communities, to work collectively on the identified priorities to ensure that all resources, assets and services are utilised to meet the needs and aspirations of individuals and communities throughout South Ayrshire. The plan ensures all delivery of provision is coordinated to avoid duplication, enhance the learning offer and ensure effective monitoring and evaluation of the activities.
- Must be launched on 1st September every 3 years previously launched in 2015, 2018 and this year in 2021.
- ▶ The requirement for CLD (Scotland) Regulations state the legal requirement to produce a plan.
