
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

DEMENTIA FRIENDLY ACTIVITY IN SOUTH CARRICK



The Girvan Promenade

In partnership with South Ayrshire Council, it is proposed to develop a dementia friendly/accessible facility at the beach. This will include the provision of coloured benches, lecterns to include 'old images of Girvan' to stimulate conversation, 2 beach wheelchairs to allow safe disabled access to the beach, the provision of defibrillators to increase the safety of the area. In addition, the Girvan Town Team are engaging with the Council to develop a 'Play Area' specification that is intergenerational and complements the Promenade proposals.



Wider Health & Care Services - Mental Health

Engagement is taking place between the Girvan & District Men's Shed and the NHS Green Spaces Officer to develop a referral system for those wishing to participate in the horticultural project at the Girvan FC football ground.



Sport and Leisure

The Girvan Town Team has promoted the development of a 'Relaxed Sports Curriculum' with the Girvan Sports Hub. Following a community consultation exercise the programme will now be rolled out across the community when it is deemed safe to do so.

DEMENTIA FRIENDLY AYR

Dementia Friendly Ayr (DFA) is now a constituted organisation and has employed a part time development worker (using the grant from Life Changes Trust).

My Story



Our 'My Story' project seeks to engage with people in Ayr who are living with dementia or worried about their memory. Through pupils from the four secondary schools in Ayr, working with local authors and the Ayr Writers' Club, we want to engage with them, safely, to allow their stories to become part of this project. As well as providing a therapeutic benefit to the individual, such stories will be important for carers to read when they are required. As conversational prompts, these will be priceless. Unfortunately, the pandemic made it very difficult for schools to be able to look beyond the core work

that they had to do with pupils. In addition, youth organisations also were unable to promote to their members. Extensive work has gone into preparing the materials for this project using a local writer who engages with secondary schools as part of his outreach role with the Scottish Book Trust to show how the kernel of a story could become something that epitomises 'My Story'. With the easing of restrictions now beginning taking place this work can be called upon again for a further iteration later in the year.

Awareness



DFA offers training, hints, and tips and how to escalate concerns about individuals who visit businesses locally or engage with community groups. Despite an initial surge of interest in the awareness training which has mainly been from partner staff, local businesses have not picked up the offer. This could be in part due to ongoing pressures local businesses have been experiencing because of the COVID-19 pandemic and further attempts will now take place to re-engage with businesses to raise awareness of the training on offer.

Built Environment



DFA are keen to be available to offer dementia-friendly design advice to any new projects that might be considered for Ayr. There is also a desire to proceed with a project on Ayr promenade ensuring that best practice and learning from Dementia Friendly Prestwick are considered by this new project.



DEMENTIA FRIENDLY ACTIVITY IN TROON



INCLUSIVE MUSIC

Life Changes Trust funded project to roll out awareness training to all venues in area that host live music, work with larger venues to ensure they are as dementia friendly as possible from layout to environment, and work with the larger festival to develop a musical offering that is accessible for people with dementia and their carers.



Due to COVID-19 restrictions this was replaced with an attempt to create a Dementia Friendly virtual choir and instrumental tuition over Zoom during lockdown. Unfortunately, this proved unsuccessful, and the project has now reverted to the original brief and work is progressing with venues and promoters as restrictions ease and further guidance is issued.

RELAXED GOLF

This is a social afternoon over the Craigend course in Troon with buggies and clubs provided. Initially run in conjunction with Alzheimer Scotland, it is now fully Dementia Friendly Troon. This project is part of the Sporting Memories network with reminiscence materials and golf at all levels and has restarted monthly. Contact has been re-established with care homes with plans to reach out to Community Mental Health Teams and Adult Support.

ALLOTMENT

Dementia Friendly Troon (DFT) has a plot at Fullarton Woods and has recently finished work creating raised beds and accessible pathways. DFT is committed to offering beds to people living with dementia locally and giving them the ownership of them to tend and reap the benefits and following the relaxation of restrictions it is planned to re-open securely and welcome people back to the plot.

DEMENTIA FRIENDLY NORTH CARRICK



Dementia Friendly North Carrick (DFNC) is now constituted. The group received funding from the Life Changes Trust for resources, equipment and groupwork. There has been a decision by the group not to commence group work while restrictions are still in place, however as restrictions begin to ease planning will now take place on the re-commencement of activities.













