
28 Councillors will be elected to serve the people and communities of South Ayrshire across eight Council wards:

# **The Count Centre**

The count hall is expected to be set up as shown in our layout plan, although this is subject to change based on operational demands on equipment and resources.


Some tables and chairs will be provided in the main hall as well as access to power points and a wireless internet connection - this is primarily for election candidates and agents.

The main guest area will be within the Ark, which is located directly off the main hall where the count is taking place.

The Ark includes ample seating and large screen TVs where you can keep up with election news and developments during the count and tea and coffee will also be available.

There is a separate secure wifi connection within the Ark - the password for access will be available to those in attendance.

There will also be a speaker feed into the Ark, so any announcements from the main hall can be picked up.



# The Count Process

The counting of votes will get underway from 8am on Friday 6 May 2022 - this will include the postal votes that have already been opened and processed.

The Single Transferable Vote (STV) system will be used for this election and all votes cast will be counted electronically.

To help keep candidates and agents informed throughout the count, display screens, announcements and other information will be available throughout the count centre to let you know what counts are active and what stages these are at.

The plasma screens will show live updates of progress of the count, including count progress, dynamic floorplan (what ballot papers are where in the process) and first preferences.

Due to the number of candidates and the staff required to process the count, each candidate will be permitted to bring along four accredited representatives, whether agent, counting agent or guest. This means the maximum attendance per candidate is five - including the candidate, agent, counting agents and guests.

The count will operate in two different zones - one zone for all three Councillor wards, and one zone for all four Councillor wards.



### Arrival

- Ballot boxes will arrive at the Citadel Leisure Centre following the close of poll at 10pm on Thursday 5 May.
- The ballot boxes will be stored securely overnight and then opened from 8am on Friday 6 May.
- Unused ballot papers will be checked at County Buildings following the close of poll.
- Postal ballot boxes will be stored securely at County Buildings and transferred to the Citadel Leisure Centre before 8am on Friday 6 May. Postal ballot boxes will be included in the relevant ballot box opening for the particular ward, rather than being opened collectively.

### Processing

- As each ballot box is opened at the pre-registration (PR) areas, the papers will be transferred into a Ballot Paper Tray - these will be clearly marked for each ward.
- Ballot Paper Account details from individual polling stations will be input into the system at Registration area
- The Ballot Paper Tray is then taken to the 'Awaiting Scanning' area. Each ballot paper is then scanned at the scanning (S) stations and the Ballot Paper Tray taken to the 'Scanning Complete' area.
- The ballot papers are then verified at the RV stations, which means the number of papers scanned is
- If there is any discrepancy, the papers within the ballot paper tray will be re-scanned. If there is a still a mismatch, the ballot paper tray will be referred for investigation.





The count process comprises reception and box opening; registration; scanning; verification; adjudication and the actual count.

The same process will be followed in each zone, which means the count process will be underway for two separate wards at the same time.

compared to the number that should have been in the Ballot Paper Tray, according to the Ballot Paper Account.

## **Adjudication**

- The system itself is able to allocate and count votes based on the scanned ballot papers.
- Any doubtful ballot papers are automatically sent by the system for adjudication, which will be carried out in full view of candidates, agents and observers at the adjudication (A) desks.
- There are two adjudication stages. The first involves the Adjudication Officer who will have the authority to accept ballots based on the Electoral Commission's guidance and adjudication placemat.
- Any queries that cannot be resolved at this stage are deferred to the Returning Officer's appointed deputes for a final decision. Only at this final adjudication stage can any ballot paper be rejected.
- All valid ballot papers will then be included in the electronic count.

# **Counting STV votes**

Voting with the Single Transferable Vote (STV) system means voters use numbers instead of a cross.

Voters number the candidates on the ballot paper in the order of choice: 1 for their first choice, 2 for their second choice, 3 for their third choice, 4 for their fourth choice and so on.

Voters can number as many or as few candidates as they like, so if there are six candidates, they can vote for just one (by writing 1 in the relevant box), all six (numbering the boxes 1-6 in order of choice) or for any number in between (again numbering from 1, depending on how many candidates they want to choose).

Before counting of the votes gets underway, the guota – the required number of votes to be elected immediately - will be calculated for each ward.

The quota number is calculated based on how many valid votes have been cast in the ward and the number of seats to be filled:

### Votes are counted in stages

Stage one: First choices are counted. Anyone who has enough first choices to reach or exceed the quota is elected. If all the seats in the ward are filled following this, the counting for this ward stops as we have a result.

#### Stage two (if needed):

Surplus votes for candidates who reach the quota are transferred to the voters' next choice. If there are still seats to fill after all the surpluses have been transferred, the candidate with the fewest votes will be excluded. Their votes will then be transferred to the voters' next choice candidate who has not been elected or excluded.

Further stages (if needed): The process of transferring surpluses and excluding candidates continues until all of the seats - three or four, depending on the ward - have been filled. There may come a point where the number of remaining candidates is equal to the number of vacancies that are unfilled. Where this is the case, the remaining candidates are deemed to be elected. This may mean some Councillors are elected without reaching the quota.

# **Declaring the results**

After advising candidates and agents of the provisional results for the particular ward, the Returning Officer will use the declaration report produced by the e-counting system to announce the results, in line with the direction from the Convener of the Electoral Management Board for Scotland.

In doing so, the Returning Officer will confirm:

- The names of the candidates elected.
- The electorate.
- The number of valid ballot papers.
- The number of rejected ballot papers under each heading
- The percentage turnout.
- The number of first preference votes for each of the candidates. •

Once a result has been declared, it is final and cannot be amended, with the named Councillors elected to serve in their relevant wards.

Only the Returning Officer will speak from the declaration stage - there will be no speeches from those elected given the amount of detail that must be announced and the number of Councillors to be elected.

The election results will be published on the Council website once all eights wards have been counted and declared. The reports published on the website will be in line with the direction from the Convener of the Electoral Management Board for Scotland.


