


Accessible Ayr is an ambitious project by South Ayrshire Council, Ayrshire Roads Alliance and Sustrans. The plan is to significantly invest in the town centre, making it a vibrant and more attractive place for people to visit and enjoy, as well as making it easier to access by pedestrians and cyclists.

A professional design team has been appointed to take forward designs for the town centre and surrounding roads. It is important that the needs and views of residents and businesses are taken into account.

The project is at a very early stage of design. Prior to the Covid pandemic, the design team had undertaken a preliminary feasibility study. However, the project had to be paused.

Alloway Street

- Footways widened
- Greening and landscaping at key points
- Loading bays, bus stops and disabled parking
- Proposed cycle track

Kyle Street

- Footways widened
- Greening and landscaping at key points
- Loading bay at south end of the street
- Disabled parking to the north of the street
- · Remains one way traffic route

Newmarket Street

- Greening & landscaping at key points and public realm improved
- Enhancement of public realm with embedded artwork, footways, seating and landscaping
- Remains a pedestrian zone during agreed hours

High Street

- High Street
 Footways widened and public areas at Grain Exchange
- and Fish Cross improved

 Graphing and landscaping along full street
- Greening and landscaping along full street
 Loading bays, bus lay by, disabled parking and taxi ranks all accomodated
- Public realm improvements to existing civic space at Grain Exchange and Fish Cross
- Remains a pedestrian zone from 6am-6pm with access permitted for buses, taxis, blue badges and loading in loading bays

Sandgate

- SanagateFootways widened
- Greening and landscaping at key points
- Loading bays, bus lay by and disabled parking all provided for
- Proposed cycle track
- Remains one way traffic route
- Creation of high quality piazza at intersection with Newmarket Street





Cycle Route Plan

The aim is to provide a safe cycling loop around the periphery of the town centre to improve connections with the town centre and also with adjoining communities, schools, the college and university. Traffic volumes have been monitored and a computer micro-simulation model created which shows the impact of changing road widths and junctions. The traffic modelling shows that a cycle track and green landscaping can be accommodated on John Street, Station Rd and Sandgate. Designs are still being considered at key junctions.

Car Park Plan

The plan shows the location of town centre car parks and walking times into the town centre. A car parking study is being undertaken that will assess how busy the car parks are and the length of time cars remain parked. This will help inform future parking suggestions for the town.



Benefits for Ayr

South Ayrshire Council is able to access funding for the project from Sustrans – bringing direct investment into the town. There is also increasing evidence from a wide range of studies about the positive benefits of town centre public realm and active travel improvements.



In 2010 Altrincham had the highest number of empty shops in the UK at 30%. The £15m public realm project has been credited with reducing vacancies and increasing footfall by 25% over 7 years.



Sheffield Grey to Green brings colour and sustainability to inner-city Sheffield, and once a month it hosts the fabulous Pollen inner city flower market.

It has transformed a tarmacked area into a green public space that encourages cycling and walking.




What ar the barriers to walking and cycling in Ayr? How do we overcome them?
