Kickstart Scheme	Discretionary	Open	The scheme, first announced by Chancellor Rishi Sunak as part of his Plan for Jobs in July 2020, will be delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP).
			The Government's Kickstart Scheme is a £2 billion fund designed to create hundreds of thousands of high quality six-month work placements for those aged 16 to 24 who are on Universal Credit and are deemed to be at risk of long term unemployment.
			Young people are more likely to have been furloughed, with many working in sectors disproportionately hit by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. The jobs created should give young people the opportunity to build their skills in the workplace and to gain experience to improve their chances of finding long-term work.

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_			Job placements should support the participants to develop the skills and experience they need to find work after completing the scheme. Young people will be referred into the new roles through their Jobcentre Plus work coach with the first Kickstarts expected to begin at the start of November 2020.
			Employers will receive funding for 100% of the relevant National Minimum Wage for 25 hours a week, plus associated employer National Insurance contributions and employer minimum auto-enrolment pension contributions. Employers will be able to top up this wage, while the Government will also pay employers £1,500 to set up support and training for people on a Kickstart placement, as well as helping pay for uniforms and other set up costs.
			There will also be extra funding to support young people to build their experience and help them move into sustained employment after they have completed their Kickstart funded job.
			Representatives applying on behalf of a group of employers can get £300 of funding to support with the associated administrative costs of bringing together these employers.
			The scheme is available to employers in England, Scotland and Wales that are looking to create new job placements for young people. Any organisation, regardless of size, can apply for funding. Applications must be for a minimum of 30 job placements and there is no cap on the number of places.
			The roles must be a minimum of 25 hours per week, for six months, paid at least the National Minimum Wage for the employees' age group. The roles should not require people to undertake extensive training before they begin the job placement.
			The job placements created with Kickstart must not:
			<ul> <li>Replace existing or planned vacancies.</li> <li>Cause existing employees or contractors to lose or reduce their employment.</li> </ul>
			Applications are open at any time.
			The scheme will initially be open until December 2021, with the option of being extended.

			To date, RRLF has approved loans from 23 charities and social enterprises, with a total value of over £8.1m.
			The RRLF is being run by Social Investment Business (SIB) with an initial £25m investment and support from <a href="Big Society Capital">Big Society Capital</a> . SIB is the lender, and will work with experienced social investor partners on delivery of the fund: <a href="Big Issue Invest">Big Issue Invest</a> , <a href="CAF Venturesome">CAF Venturesome</a> , <a href="Charity">Charity</a> <a href="Bank">Bank</a> , <a href="Resonance">Resonance</a> , <a href="Social Investment Scotland">Social and Sustainable Capital</a> and <a href="Wales Council for Voluntary Action">Wales</a> <a href="Council for Voluntary Action">Council for Voluntary Action</a> . Other delivery partners may be added in future. See below for where to apply.
			The £25m is part of a wider package of support announced by Big Society Capital.
			£4m worth of grant funding has also been made available to be used alongside the Resilience and Recovery Loan Fund to support charities and social enterprises based in and delivering the majority of their impact in England. Those applying for loans under the RRLF might be eligible for part of the total amount approved to be provided as a grant, reducing the amount repayable.
